I am an oncology nurse and palliative care researcher, originally from Taiwan. I have been interested in end-of-life care and palliative care research and undertaking palliative care research and clinical practice for people living with cancer for more than ten years. During study for my undergraduate and masters degrees in Taiwan (completed in 2014), I developed a questionnaire to investigate the nurses' attitude and behavior toward end-of-life care among advanced cancer patients in inpatient hospitals. In 2016, I conducted a PhD in palliative care at the Cicely Saunders Institute of Palliative Care, Policy and Rehabilitation, King's College London, United Kingdom to receive postgraduate research training. I am particularly interested in advance care planning, medical decision-making at end-of-life and research methodology in palliative care.

During the three years of PhD study period, I published four high-quality research papers in advance care planning in the top-ranking journal (Palliative Medicine and Journal of Palliative Medicine). I delivered seven presentations at national and international congresses (e.g. European Association for Palliative Care) to disseminate the research results. I am involved in many international collaborations (e.g. WHO founded palliative care evaluation among six countries worldwide, Asia advance care planning Delphi study among six sectors, systematic review in advance care planning projects with Erasmus MC, the Netherland). I received funding and academic prizes along with the PhD study (e.g. Global Research Grant, NIHR CLAHRC thesis stipend, oral presentation prize in King's College London PhD conference). I am also appointed as visiting research fellow at Cicely Saunders Institute of Palliative Care, Policy and Rehabilitation, King's College London. Together, these publications, presentations, awards and international collaborations demonstrate my enthusiasm and success in conducting research in palliative care globally and generating ideas that have been judged by peers as being valuable scientific contributions. I am the principal investigator of a three-year project to develop an advance care planning program for community older people with chronic illness funded by National Science and Technology Council, Taiwan (ref: MOST 111-2314-B-A49 -012 -MY3). I am a passionate and diligent palliative care researcher, who is keen to advance research skills by working as an assistant professor in community health care, school of Nursing, National Yang Ming Chiao Tung University, Taiwan.
